- Matthew 24:13, "But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved."
- Luke 8:13, "They on the rock are they, which, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, which for a while believe, and in time of temptation fall away."
- John 8:31, "Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed;"
- John 10:27, "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me:"
- Acts 13:43, "Now when the congregation was broken up, many of the Jews and religious proselytes followed Paul and Barnabas: who, speaking to them, persuaded them to continue in the grace of God."
- Acts 14:22, "Confirming the souls of the disciples, and exhorting them to continue in the faith, and that we must through much tribulation enter into the kingdom of God."
- Romans 2:7, "To them who by patient continuance in well doing seek for glory and honour and immortality, eternal life:"
- 1 Corinthians 15:2, "By which also ye are saved, if ye keep in memory what I preached unto you, unless ye have believed in vain."
- 2 Corinthians 13:5, "Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves. Know ye not your own selves, how that Jesus Christ is in you, except ye be reprobates?"
- Philippians 2:12, "Wherefore, my beloved, as ye have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling."
- Colossians 1:22-23, "In the body of his flesh through death, to present you holy and unblameable and unreprouvable in his sight: If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and be not moved away from the hope of the gospel, which ye have heard, and which was preached to every creature which is under heaven; whereof I Paul am made a minister;"
- 2 Tim. 2:12, "If we suffer, we shall also reign with him: if we deny him, he also will deny us:"
- James 1:22, "But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves."
- 2 Peter 1:10, "Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall:"
- 2 Peter 3:17, "Ye therefore, beloved, seeing ye know these things before, beware lest ye also, being led away with the error of the wicked, fall from your own stedfastness."
- 1 John 2:19, "They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would no doubt have continued with us: but they went out, that they might be made manifest that they were not all of us."

**“ASSURANCE I CONFIDENCE I HOPE” in HEBREWS**

- 3:6, “But Christ as a son over his own house; whose house are we, if we hold fast the **confidence** and the rejoicing of the **hope** firm unto the end.”
- 3:14, “For we are made partakers of Christ, if we hold the beginning of our **confidence** stedfast unto the end;”
- 4:16, “Let us therefore come boldly [lit: with **confidence**] unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need.”
- 6:11, “And we desire that every one of you do shew the same diligence to the full **assurance** of **hope** unto the end:”
- 6:18, “That by two immutable things, in which it was impossible for God to lie, we might have a strong consolation, who have fled for refuge to lay hold upon the **hope** set before us:”
- 7:19, “For the law made nothing perfect, but the bringing in of a better **hope** did; by the which we draw nigh unto God.”
- 10:19, “Having therefore, brethren, boldness [lit. **confidence**] to enter into the holiest by the blood of Jesus.”
- 10:22, “Let us draw near with a true heart in full **assurance** of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water.”
- 10:23, “Let us hold fast the profession of our faith [lit. **hope**] without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;).”
- 10:35, “Cast not away therefore your **confidence**, which hath great recompence of reward.”
- 11:1 “Now faith is the substance [lit: **assurance**] of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.”
- 13:6, “So that we may boldly [lit: **confidently**] say, The Lord is my helper, and I will not fear what man shall do unto me?”
